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Summer School Policies

- All students **must** attend the first day of summer school **at 8:30 AM** (regardless of session preference) to receive their username and password for Plato, as well as other important information.
 - *AM/PM session assignment will be given out at this time.*
- Exceptions to first day attendance *may* be made due to another obligation **only if it is communicated to an administrator at the high school prior to summer school beginning.**
- Students are allowed to work on summer school classes at home as long as they have the proper technology; however, **all pre-tests, post-tests, and final exams must be taken at the high school during Summer School hours.**
- Students must complete all coursework with a passing grade by the end of the Summer School term (July 30th). Extensions will not be granted.

Students who come to the high school to work on their summer school courses during designated summer school hours are typically more successful in completing their courses and earning their credits.

Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE) –

Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) provides students with opportunities to gain work experience in the agriculture field(s) in which they are interested. Students work with their Ag teacher, parents, and/or employers to get the most out of their SAE program. Your work experience areas could include placement, entrepreneurship, or research in 42 different fields. It is worth one credit.

Requirements: Student must work 15 hours each week of summer and meet with Mr. Fowler four times over the summer. This course can be used as the required Ag course to be involved with FFA during the 19-20 school year.
