We are pleased that you are considering earning Indiana University credit through the Advance College Project while you are still in high school.

ACP partners with over 150 high schools and has more than 500 qualified instructors offering over 15,000 high schools students the opportunity to start their college career at Indiana University.

Students wishing to participate in the ACP program must meet these basic requirements:

- Be a student in good academic standing and on track for college
- Have a minimum of a 2.70 GPA on a 4.00 grading scale
- Be taking a college preparatory curriculum

Only students who meet these criteria and register on time will be able to receive IU credit for courses offered through the ACP program.

Once you and a parent or guardian have decided you want to participate in the program then the next steps are easy. We will email you your registration instructions and open registration dates. Registration must be completed during the open registration window to be registered for your IU course(s).

Students who have registered for their IU courses through the ACP program will earn official IU credits and course grades which will appear on the student's official IU transcript that can be transferred to IU or other colleges. Students that may plan on attending a non-IU institution should contact the institution to see how their IU credits will transfer.

Dear Parent or Guardian,

The Advance College Project is happy to offer your student a chance to get an early start on a college education. Indiana University classes offered in the high school are a great way to begin this process. By participating in IU courses through the Advance College Project, your student is taking the first step to their college education.

ACP partners with over 150 high schools and has more than 500 qualified instructors offering over 15,000 high schools students the opportunity to start their college career at Indiana University.

Students wishing to participate in the ACP program must meet these basic requirements:

- Be a student in good academic standing and on track for college
- Have a minimum of a 2.70 GPA on a 4.00 grading scale
- Be taking a college preparatory curriculum

Only students who meet these criteria and register on time will be able to receive IU credit for courses offered through the ACP program.

In order to make the decision whether your student should take ACP course(s) for IU credit, it is important to read and consider the information in this letter and the student letter. Because the ACP program wants this experience to be beneficial to your student, it is important to consider:

- Is your student preparing to attend college?
- Does your student meet the GPA criteria, 2.70 GPA on a 4.00 scale?
- Can we afford to pay for these courses (\$25 per credit hour – most classes are 3 credit hours) or do we qualify for tuition waiver (IU tuition for ACP courses is waived for students eligible for Free/Reduced lunch)?

Does your student understand:

- The basic requirements of financial responsibility?
- The impact of their IU grade on their permanent college record (transcript)?
- The consequences of withdrawing from a college course (if need be)?
- How to request a transcript following graduation?
- The financial and academic benefits of starting their college career now?

If you have read all materials and feel ACP courses are appropriate for your student then the next steps are easy. We will email your student online registration instructions and open registration dates.

If there are questions about how the credits will transfer, then just contact potential colleges and universities regarding the transferability of each ACP dual credit course. If students are attending any IU campus there is no need to transfer credit, all IU coursework through the ACP program is automatically recorded on the student's IU transcript.

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### Tuition Schedule for ACP Courses 2015-2016 School Year

The Advance College Project works to maintain a reasonable cost structure for high school students that is less than the standard rate for students on campus. For the 2015-2016 school year ACP tuition will be \$25.00/credit hour (subject to change based upon action by the Indiana Commission for Higher Education). Indiana University does not charge ACP students any additional fees, such as activity, technology, athletic, or health fees. An ACP Tuition Waiver is available for students who meet the program's eligibility requirements and are eligible for the National School Lunch Program. **Students should contact potential colleges and universities regarding the transferability of each ACP dual credit course.**

### MEMORANDUM

To: ACP Students, Teachers, & Guidance Counselors  
Subject: Core Transfer Library

To enable students to transfer college credits, Indiana has developed the Core Transfer Library (CTL)—a list of courses that will transfer among Indiana public college and university campuses, assuming adequate grades.

CTL courses will transfer in one of two ways:

- 1) the course will receive credit for the designated equivalent course at the transfer campus and meet the transfer campus degree program requirements in an equivalent manner, or
- 2) if there is no agreed-upon directly equivalent course, the CTL course will transfer as an elective requirement of the undergraduate degree program provided the program has room for elective credits, i.e., as undistributed credit.

College courses not on the CTL may still transfer to other institutions as undistributed credit. The back of this page categorizes all ACP courses as either CTL or non-CTL.
